I get excited to see them.

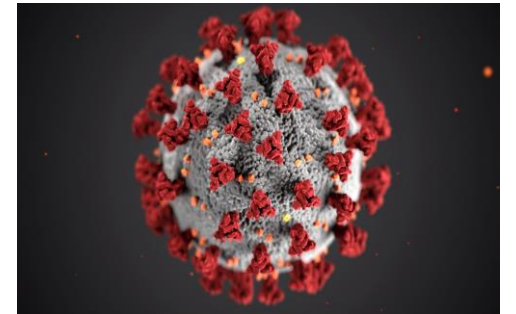


Sometimes I get so excited that I want to go over to the visitor and hug them.

I can smile.



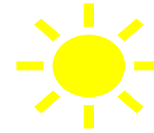
